

Dear Fourth Medio:

I have chosen this epigraph for my words to you tonight for something I would like to comment on later, which is related to the unhappy state of the world today. Not all is bad news though, there is much else on which to comment!

First, let me say your teachers see you as a united group that is always ready to participate in different school activities. In contrast to other levels, you seem to have survived the pandemic in very good shape, both emotionally and in academic terms, which is no small thing, and you apparently enjoyed your musical enormously. More on that later!

Every generation likes to think there is something that make them special and usually find something that they feel makes them who they are. It is a classical identity question and one that we all ask of ourselves at different moments. I do not know what you see as your special characteristic, but I can tell you what makes you a very special group for your school. You are the first group to graduate that has done the full Project-Based learning experience starting in Fifth Grade.

I remember walking into your classrooms after a few weeks, and seeing some of you researching on a computer, others busy doing the same in books, and still others discussing something round a table. It was everything we hoped would happen and it seemed like magic. The landscape of what a Fifth-Grade classroom looked like had been completely transformed and we all felt very proud. We had dared to reimagine learning, and you were the proof that it was possible! And it wasn't just about you.... You were the pioneers of something that transformed all Dunalastair Schools, so of course you are very special to us. We feel even more proud, and so should you, when we see the number of schools across the country who have followed our example, often with our assistance.

But let's talk about something else of which you must also feel very proud... I mean "all that being dead thing". I must admit I had to laugh at that phrase, 'the being dead thing'. It's like saying, "dead?... whatever!" Death is always considered a very big thing, so big that we prefer not to talk about it very much. So, seeing that it is something to laugh at is quite a welcome change. And thank you for including me in the script, especially as I was not one of those that was dead... I'm "ready, set, BUT NOT YET!!" Thank you also for inviting

me to dance with the ghosts... I'm sure my attempt at being scary was probably less convincing than Adam and Barbara's, but it was great fun as was all of your wonderful performance of Beetlejuice: "a show about death!"

There are various themes in Beetlejuice that are interesting, beyond that of not taking death too seriously, such as leaving things until it is too late (I mean Adam and Barbara's baby that was never to be) or the drive to see commercial opportunities in everything (Charles's idea of turning the house into a ghost theme park). But the one the struck me the most, because we see it often in schools, is Lydia's loneliness and sense of invisibility after the death of her mother: vour invisible when you're sad. And the very poignant line "seems when you lose your mom, no one turns off the sun". The upside of this sad beginning to the musical is that Lydia in the end comes good. After all the "Shake, shake, señora" comes the "Daylight com' and me wan' go home". She has been wanting to go home from the beginning, but now she feels she is home! And the lesson is... adolescence can be difficult, sometimes very difficult, but things get better, especially during what will be your next few years of initiating adulthood.

Let me now turn for a while to the world into which you will now be entering. I am sure it is a world you must be looking at with some hesitation. After all, there seem to be a great number of dark clouds on the horizon:

- >> Climate change, which we see all around us, including our current temperatures (and rain?) that are very unusual for this time of year.
- >> At the same time, there are worrying signs that the form of government that we have preferred for a long time, that is liberal democracies, appears to be weakening everywhere if not collapsing, in a world that seems ever more polarized.
- >> And though we are told that we are living in one of the most peaceful periods of humanity, the terrible war in Ukraine, that is nearly two years old, has over half a million casualties. And in the last month or so we have witnessed the tragic events involving Palestinians and Israelis, two well-loved communities with which we have all grown up, both with stories to tell of atrocities that have affected their families or friends and caused them terrible pain... This is the reason I chose the words of Martin Luther King as the epigraph for tonight's words to you.

Returning hate for hate multiplies hate, adding deeper darkness to a night already devoid of stars. Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that.

I hope you will treasure these words! They come from someone who was fighting brutal discrimination in his day, and yet they talk about the power of love.

But you are also the generation that will go out into a world that has seen the appearance of very powerful tools thanks to advances in artificial intelligence including the appearance of ChatGPT. This is very much of a game changer, with opportunities and risks as is always the case with technological advances. Some wit has said that the reason we need artificial intelligence is that there is so much natural stupidity. It will be generations like yours that must make sure that the intelligence and the stupidity do not become partners –as in the conflicts I just mentioned.

The world you will be entering is an uncertain place, but it is also a very exciting one. One you needn't be afraid of, just as you are not afraid of 'that being dead thing'! You are well prepared and have talent to spare..

"So, dear class of 23, it's now time for you to leave." Good night and good luck!

PLAYGROUP | My House

The Scottish tradition, which defines the identity of our school, led us to introduce houses named after major clans. The Playgroup level marks the entrance to our school and there is a milestone of learning about the characteristics of their House, including their colour, tartan or family crest. The students work on Identity by learning about the history of the school and its founder, Mrs Ada Crew.















PREKINDER | The Four BS

The school has a positive behaviour policy which emphasises looking at what we want to see (rather than what we do not want to see). We call this our 4 Bs: Be Safe, Be Responsible, Be Respectful and Be Nice. These broad categories of behaviour guide the actions of our community. During one special week our Prekinder students carry out concrete actions in which they can visualise and experience the behaviours expected at school.





















The appreciation of beauty is another of the school's educational objectives. For this reason, between Year 3 & 6 all students learn to play an instrument of their choice and take part in the school orchestra or band.

In Year 3 they perform a concert for their parents and teachers for the first time. Playing together allows them to develop skills that will be fundamental in the future.



















YEAR 6 | Challenge Camp

Year 6 students are invited to strengthen their teamwork skills, especially those of collaboration, communication and empathy, in a two and a half day trip to a mountain lodge. They practice assertive communication and collaboration by playing Capture the Flag and Treasure Hunt. They also develop respect and care for the environment









YEAR 8 | Knowledge Journey

In 8 Year, students go on a study trip designed not only to have an academic impact, but also to strengthen the bonds between the students before starting high school. To do this, they prepare their trip by studying different aspects of the environment of the place they are going to visit, researching the geography, the original and current human settlements, the flora and fauna, the productive resources, among others. They organise this research in their logbooks and present it to their fellow students.























Seniors | Class Musical

The end of our students' school journey is marked by the Year 12 Musical. This final project allows students to further develop their teamwork, communication and empathy skills; to strengthen their bonds as a group and provide a welcome distraction from university entrance exams.
